Northern Lake George Paddle will have a two-court platform tennis facility with a warming hut and viewing deck.

Platform Tennis, also known as paddle, combines the best elements of tennis, racquetball and squash, and is an easy to learn sport for players of all ages and abilities. The official Grand Opening will be Friday, July 11, 2014 from 9 – 11 am. There will be free lessons and food for all. Participants should wear comfortable clothing and NLG Paddle will provide the equipment.

For July and August there will be introductory free play for everyone. Any adult can sign up for a court, borrow paddles and play between 10 am and 5 pm by registering in advance at the Golf Pro Shop at Ticonderoga Country Club. After 5 pm, guests can sign up for a court and borrow equipment from Eddie's Restaurant. All juniors must be accompanied by at least one adult. Donations will be graciously accepted and will support our youth leadership program called "Platform for Life".

"Platform for Life" is Northern Lake George Paddle's youth leadership program designed to inspire and impassion area youth through positive mentoring and job training. Patty Hogan and Andrea McDonald started this youth initiative last year, placing three Ticonderoga 8th graders in a three week farm/job training program in Shelburne, Vermont. This year, the Platform for Life Coaches team has expanded and to include Dave and Beth Iuliano from Eddie's Restaurant, George Mackey from Ticonderoga Country Club and Jay Wells from Five Nations Golf.

According to promoter, Patty Hogan, "Our profits will help fund an after school Paddle Program for kids and will also go towards youth efforts in the community including our own "Platform for Life" Leadership program.
