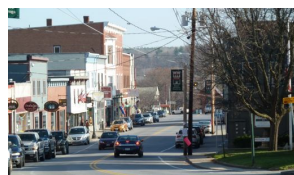

It's Happening

North Country Community College and Jasama LLC Ink a Deal for Downtown Student Housing

A very key component in Ticonderoga Downtown Revitalization is now in place. North Country Community College (NCCC) and Jasama LLC, an independent real estate development firm, have agreed on a deal to build dormitory/study "cluster" student housing along Montcalm Street.

This project will have an impact on both Ticonderoga and the school. NCCC wants to expand their Ti Campus in both student body size and academic offerings. The campus currently hosts approximately 150 students, but could double that student body if housing was available.

Under the agreement, Jasama LLC will create dormitory suites for 16 students in the upper level of what is known as the Huestis Building, next door

to Sunshine Laundry, in time for the 2013 Fall Semester.

The two quad dorms will each consist of 4 double dorm rooms sharing a kitchen and a common room for study, living, and casual classroom use. A bakery is planning to open this spring in the first floor retail space.

A New Energy for Downtown Ti

This is the first phase of NCCC's plan for student housing in Ti. The next phase, targeted for fall 2014, will accommodate another 48 students in the top two floors of the Cobbler's Bench building on Montcalm Street. Additional locations for 2015 will also be developed.

According to Dr. Steve Tyrell, President of NCCC, "NCCC is building on our success of integrating our student bodies into the downtown communities in Saranac and Malone. This approach allows the students to live close to campus but become part of a community. It also breathes young energy into the community, creates a student economy, and incentivizes students to continue life here after graduation. Its a win-win for NCCC and Ticonderoga."

Chattie Van Wert, Director of the Ticonderoga Revitalization Alliance (TRA) said, "We are so pleased that the Ti Alliance was able to help these two organizations discover their common interests. This is exactly the work that TRA wants to enable. Now it's up to the school and developer to bring this project to a reality, but we will be with them all the way, helping to facilitate wherever we are needed."

Workforce Readiness Program Coming to Ticonderoga High

Employers and schools sync up to train students to be great employees.

Ti-Alliance began a "curriculum" discussion group just eight weeks ago. The goal was to invite the largest local employers, Ticonderoga Central Schools, and North Country Community College to talk about how to match up employer needs with curriculum to better qualify graduates for local jobs.

We are pleased to announce the first high-impact result of these discussions. Beginning with the Class of 2014, all Ti High senior students will receive the nationally accredited coursework for Workforce Readiness. It will be taught as part of the state-mandated Economics course for all senior students.

The course covers various aspects of preparing to enter the workforce and significantly impacts the on-the-job success rate of employees who take the course.



The Workforce Readiness Certificate is recognized by employers throughout the United States as a standard for good employees. In the Ticonderoga area, employers will be giving preferred status to applicants with the certificate.

In addition to making this important coursework available to our high school students, TRA and the Ticonderoga Area Chamber of Commerce are working toward being able to offer this same course to adults in Ticonderoga. The course is already available to adults through OneWorkSource in Elizabethtown, but we will be announcing a local course in the near future.

New Business Incubation Program Coming to Ti

How do we stimulate our local economy? One way is to bring new businesses here and create jobs. That's not easy, but a new program from TRA is focused on attracting new ventures to our area.

It's called a Business Incubator, a concept that has been used for years in communities around the country. As defined by Wikipedia, Business Incubators are "programs designed to support the successful development of entrepreneurial companies through an array of business support resources and services, developed and orchestrated by incubator management and offered both in the incubator and through its network of contacts."

Recognizing that our TRA partners have an amazing array of resources at their disposal, we're coordinating those resources into incentive packages to entice entrepreneurs to start businesses here in the Ti Area. The goal is to foster 3-5 new businesses each year and help them grow a healthy future in our area. Ultimately this creates jobs and economy for the region.

In the coming months, TRA will be reaching out to help people in our own community and beyond to start new businesses in the Ticonderoga Area.

Our outreach will include working with graduate engineering and computer science programs at universities throughout the area to find recent graduates ready to commercialize their research.

These North Country scholars need places to establish their technology companies and we will offer incentives to start those companies here.

For example, we have a fair amount of empty commercial space in the downtown area, most of which has been empty for more than a year. A landlord can put their property into our incubation program and offer a reduced rent to a new tenant that we might be able to find for them.



The advantage to a landlord is that without this new business in the space, they would likely still have non-revenue generating space a year from now. Instead, they could have a new rent-paying tenant in six months.

TRA partners also include companies that provide many types of business services. Depending on the needs of the new businesses, we could offer some of those services at deep discount to help during start-up months.

Financing is always a key component of a new business. All of the local banks and county funding agencies are TRA partners. We can help identify funding challenges and find appropriate resources.

- Let us find you a tenant. If you own empty commercial space in the area, talk to us about including it in the Business Incubator.

- Be a business mentor. TRA will build an advisory team for each incubated business to help them achieve their goals. It doesn't require a lot of your time, just your brain. If you have been successful in business, you didn't do it alone. Pay it forward and help someone else.
- Be on one of our review teams. This spring TRA will review applications and business plans submitted to our program to choose the best plans suited to our community.
- Participate in "Habitat for Business". This spring we'll be doing a little "rehab" on buildings that will host our new businesses. Local retailers will donate materials, but we need volunteers to paint, lay carpet, install a light.....you get the idea. Volunteer for a workday and a lot of fun next spring.
